In June, Local Cloth achieved a long time goal. We moved into a new 3000 sqft community fiber studio in the River Arts District. This new space features a classroom, studios, dye lab, and exhibit and retail space showcasing locally sourced items.

Shop Local Cloth - Inspired by the 2020 fiber artist & farmers needs assessment survey, we opened our retail space. Representing 39 selling artists, with a favorable commission split 75/25. In our first year we have exceeded sales estimates.

Fiber Farmers Day | May 1, 2021 14 WNC fiber farmers gathered at the WNC Farmer's Market to sell their fiber and fiber products from the animals they raise.

Local Cloth Open House | June 12, 2021 Members were invited into the new 3,000 sq ft community fiber studio and retail space to celebrate our grand opening.

Kay Speckman Estate Sale | July 2 & 3, 2021 Kay, an accomplished milliner and fiber artist passed away in February and Local Cloth members helped her husband, Ernie, clean out her studio and find good homes for her materials and equipment.

Fleece to Shawl Exhibit at SAFF | Oct 22 - 24, 2021 A generous group of fiber farmers and artists volunteered their time and their fleece at the Local Cloth booth to demonstrate the steps of making a product starting with roving. 3 shawls were made that weekend and will be auctioned off with the proceeds going to Blue Ridge Blankets.

Farmer's Spotlight | Second Saturdays 4 farmers visited Shop Local Cloth to talk about the products and experiences from their farm.

Holiday Market | December 4, 2021 We had our most successful market yet in the new studio. 12 vendors sold their handmade goods, including knitted accessories, needle felted creations, quilted homegoods, yarn, roving and raw fleece.



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Membership

We added 51 more members in 2021, ending the year with 236 active members.

New member levels: Wool, Angora, Alpaca all with a professional add on opportunity for fiber businesses. All new levels include additional benefits.

Blue Ridge Blanket Project

Our mission is to connect fiber farmers, processors, dyers and weavers all together in order to make yarn and blankets made from animals raised in WNC. Proceeds from blanket sales will be put back into the project, enabling us to keep the project going. Initial funding was provided by a Natural and Cultural Resources grant from The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina. We have purchased all of the necessary fiber for the sample blankets: wool, alpaca and mohair. We are now looking for the weavers. We anticipate buying several more pounds of fiber at this year's Fiber Farmers Day.
